Official Statement from The Conservative Caucus, DC Chapter

February 4, 2026

The Conservative Caucus, DC Chapter, proudly salutes President Donald J. Trump for the extraordinary early-2026 crime reductions in Washington, DC. The year-to-date data (compared to the same period in 2025) is undeniable:

- Homicides: down 80%
- Robberies: down 58%
- Motor vehicle thefts: down 57%
- Burglaries: down 28%
- Total crime: down 26%

These improvements coincide with renewed federal engagement, enhanced coordination between federal and local law enforcement, and policies drawn directly from President Trump’s **Make DC Safe & Beautiful** initiative, an approach that has moved the district beyond years of failed local leadership toward becoming a national model of what happens when law and order is chosen over chaos. In 2025 alone, U.S. Marshals Service operations removed more than 8,400 violent fugitives and seized 856 illegal firearms from DC streets, directly contributing to the sharp decline in crime we are now seeing.

While local leaders and activists spent years demanding to “defund the police” and coddled criminals with revolving-door “justice,” President Trump backed the blue, empowered prosecutors, secured our streets, and demanded accountability. The results speak for themselves.

Residents, families, workers, and visitors to the district are experiencing the positive effects of leadership that takes crime seriously and responds decisively. The Conservative Caucus, DC Chapter encourages leaders at every level to learn from what is working, support effective public-safety strategies, and commit to policies that protect law-abiding citizens and restore trust in our institutions.
